Your Excellency,

The Micronational Professional Registry (MPR) is a serious unrecognised government organisation (SUGO). While certain government organisations only accept independent states or nations without states that are indigenous and ancient as members, and exclude all other nations, the MPR will accept any organised nation or micronation that is endorsed by someone who is 21 or older, and demonstrates to be a true professional. Yes, as you may notice, we do things a little differently at the MPR, but that also reminds us of the ways of another great country.

The MPR, which paradoxically is not a governmental organisation, currently recognises in a *de facto* manner 3 Fourth World nations, 11 Fifth World nations, and 18 Sixth World nations. The MPR also recognises 22 sovereign states; 11 US states, 'shelf nations', and international organisations; and 3 cities or inhabited localities. The MPR also recognises government agencies, universities, schools, news agencies, alternative DNS root name server systems, and non-profit organisations.

Besides being a real professional registry, the MPR also issues independent intellectual property instruments such as Print Monopolies, Enterprise Names, Enterprise Marks, and MPR Patents, and thus protects intellectual property independently of other nations or international conventions.

On 30 March 2010, a US Judge struck down a patent on cancer genes, thanks also in part to the efforts of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) and the Public Patent Foundation. However, the MPR has always maintained the view that life form patents are not legitimate, or that they do not encourage progress or human rights, and the MPR doesn't allow or recognise patents on human genes, unlike the US Patent Office, which has so far allowed the biotechnology industry to ludicrously claim about 20% of the human genome.

In the past, the MPR has also published official warnings about verified terrorist micronations, and has even succeeded in prosecuting scam artists who were running a diploma mill

that was violating the rights, and sullyng the reputation of a micronation called the Principality of Sealand. So the MPR has even exercised the functions of states from time to time, when it was absolutely necessary in order to protect highly discriminated micronations.

It has recently come to our attention that in a Plenary Session, the Peruvian Congress has declared a moratorium of ten years in order to prevent the import of Genetically Modified Organisms (GMOs) on the national territory for cultivation, breeding, or for any transgenic production.

The approved norm establishes a moratorium of ten years on GMOs; determines as competent authority on the subject the Ministry of the Environment; and creates a Technical Commission of Evaluation and Prevention of the Risks of Use of GMOs, which in two years will have to issue a report on the subject.


Most importantly, despite the pressure of most other South American countries to jump on the GM bandwagon, the approved norm by your national government bucks this trend, and is a sincere effort to preserve Peru's biodiversity.

In October 2010, when China attacked Norway for its courage in controversially granting human rights activist Liu Xiaobo the 2010 Nobel Peace Prize, despite the fact that no Norwegian national had ever signed up for membership in our organisation, the MPR added Norway anyway to its list of recognised sovereign states.

For the recent action undertaken by the Peruvian Congress to issue a ten-year moratorium on all GM planting, the Micronational Professional Registry (MPR) has officially declared Peru "the world's only Fifth World sovereign state", the only sovereign state that is at least trying to prepare for the prophesied Fifth World to come, and we will make Peru the 23rd sovereign state recognised by the MPR!

Please communicate to your government our most sincere admiration and gratitude. We hope one day to be able to visit the beautiful and meaningful country of Peru.
